In 2023, we achieved great progress in our mission, thanks to the incredible support of our community. This year, we celebrated the completion of several key projects that are already making a significant impact on the lives of our children.

With funds raised at the 2022 Tux & Tennies Gala and Auction, we built a new playground tailored to better serve our older teens. This playground now offers them a dedicated space to relax, play, and connect.

Following the success of our independent living house, Journey Home, preparations for a second home for six female youth are underway. We can't wait for this new house to transform into a warm, supportive, and functional space where young women can transition smoothly into adulthood.

Another highlight was the completion of our Creative Vibes Studio, made possible by a generous grant from the Kaiser Foundation. This new facility is devoted to music and dance therapy, offering our youth creative outlets for self-expression and healing.

Additionally, thanks to grant funding, we completed a major recruitment and staffing initiative. This effort has allowed us to significantly expand our team, ensuring we have the dedicated staff needed to provide the highest level of care and support to our youth.

As we reflect on these achievements, we are filled with gratitude and hope for the future. With the continued support of our community, we are confident that we will continue to make a lasting impact on the lives of the children we serve.

We have a total commitment to treating all children and families with fairness, dignity and respect regardless of race, age, creed, ethnicity, orientation or ability.


#### STAFF SERVICES
